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About this Position

The Research Advisor (RA) supports students throughout their research projects, from developing topics and writing prospectuses to designing studies and conducting literature searches. They review manuscript drafts before publication and ensure work meets OUM's academic standards. This role is essential for guiding students to achieve high-quality research outcomes.

Position Responsibilities

Research Guidance

- Assist students in selecting research topics that are suitable and manageable.
- Assist and guide students to develop and conduct a research project.
- Provide advice and guidance on ethical and responsible conduct of research.
- Review and provide feedback on submitted research prospectuses and manuscripts.
- Respond promptly and thoroughly to student communications and written work, providing constructive feedback
- Monitor and report on student research activities and progress.
- Ensure students are aware of research program requirements and deadlines.
- Document progress and discussions in student records.
- Foster a positive, collaborative atmosphere and be responsive to student mental health and well-being needs.

Engagement

- Attend Research Club and other university-sponsored research activities as approved by your supervisor.
- Maintain regular contact with students via email and online meetings.

Governance and Risk Management

- Ensure student research complies with ethical standards, laws, and regulations and promote safe research practices.
- Follow established university policies, procedures and templates.
- Identify and mitigate risk to the University and support service improvement.
- Support opportunities for innovation, evaluation, and improved service delivery.
- Promote a safe environment prioritizing the health and safety of all stakeholders.
- Treat everyone with respect and equity, maintaining a discrimination-free environment.
- Protect the intellectual property and content of student work.
- Stay updated on University policies and respond promptly to communications.

- 1. PhD, or other research higher degree from an accredited university in health, medicine, biomedical or social sciences.
- 2. Minimum 5 years of research experience including publications in peer-reviewed journals...
- 3. Knowledge of ethics requirements for research involving humans or their data.
- 4. Strong interpersonal skills for professional support and collaboration with diverse stakeholders.



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- 5. Ability to use initiative for problem-solving, prioritizing tasks, meeting deadlines, and work productivity in a team environment.
- 6. Proficiency in digital tools, including Google Workspace and Zoom...
